# SUMMARY FROM THE DRAFT MINUTES OF THE MEETING ON 19 JUNE 2019

### **PUBLIC SESSION**

A resident raised concerns that the proposed location for the Porthaven Care Home was squeezing in too much, not providing sufficient access to green space for residents, and would increase traffic in the area. Cllr Kettel stated that at the open day presentation by Porthaven most attendees (over 70 attended) supported the development, with some concerns over traffic, parking and a specific tree on the current site. Porthaven have stated that staff would not be located onsite when off duty and all would be fully trained, thus any increase in the call on local doctors would be minimal.

### REPORTS FROM COMMITTEES

### **Highways**

Colin Coulson will carry out maintenance of the planted areas near Freestone's Corner and the Memorial Monument.

### **Planning**

Support for the Hinxton Parish Council letter re the Wellcome Genome proposals was discussed. The only sections that impact on Great Shelford are traffic flow, local air quality and tree replacement.

### **Recreation Ground**

Shelford and Stapleford Strikers Football Club: a Youth training session will overlap with a similar Youth Cricket Club session. Both parties have agreed to coordinate and share facilities. Pitch arrangements were requested for the 2019/20 season for two teams on Saturday (am) and two teams on Sunday (am and pm). The Clerk is to agree as there is no impact on other use.

Cricket Club Use Summer 2019: there will be an additional Youth section running a second training programme, due to the great success of the first early summer training programme.

Antisocial Behaviour Complaints: a further dog attack on a youth cricket player has taken place. Councillor Price is to investigate and report necessary action. Persons unknown have removed the combination locks on the senior goal sets and relocated them overnight. The Clerk has notified GSFC for urgent replacement.



Feast Storage: it is suggested that the Parish Council should provide a secure exterior store area. The Clerk was instructed to provide proposals and a quote.

Memorial Hall Car Park: car space white lines and No Parking yellow hatched areas have now been completed. Parking on yellow-lined areas continues to be inconsiderate and a notice is needed. Safety bollards on the walkway at the side of the Memorial Hall have now been replaced with a more substantial type.

Power to the Green Shelter: a quotation was requested for providing lighting, USB charging points and a trial CCTV web-based single camera installation at the corner of the Memorial Hall. (

Asbestos Test Bore Holes (previously approved): additional areas are to be included within the quoted approval.

Automated External Defibrillator (DeFib) in the Pavilion: no training arrangements have yet been made. With a considerable number of youth activities taking place over the summer period, clubs using the facilities will be reminded of the equipment available.

Ladies' Toilet in the Pavilion: Sawston Flooring has been contacted for a quotation to repair the leak.

Tennis Club Lease: this is currently expired. A new lease or licence agreement will now require a legal document. A Parish Council Legal Services tender is to be drafted by the Clerk and Councillor Davies. Councillor Watson will discuss the status with the Tennis Club. A legal support budget will be considered for future years.

Cricket Ball Protection Netting: Councillor Kettel updated the Parish Council on the status of the Operational Agreement and agreed to draft a letter to the residents. The Clerk stated that there is a budget of £10,000 for portable netting for the play area.

### REPORTS FROM COORDINATING OFFICERS

Neighbourhood plan The recent survey received 411 responses.

**Police** Cllr Ashton is to arrange another progress meeting with the police. The public can report observed crimes at <a href="https://www.cambs.police.uk/report/REPORT">https://www.cambs.police.uk/report/REPORT</a> **Scouts & Guides** The Scout Hut lease needs reviewing and the need for an Energy Performance Certificate considered – to be included in the legal scope document. Councillor Ashurst will prepare a proposal for replacement external doors.

**SSYI** The Club Room lease is to be included in the legal scope document. Buildings insurance requires clarification and work needs to be undertaken on the area (external doors in particular). Dardan Security Patrols will cover entrance door security at no additional cost to the Parish Council.



### **HEIDI ALLEN**



I know from my inbox that many of you share my concerns about the acute pressures on our NHS. Last month, I called a debate in Parliament to challenge the Health Minister about this and press for a much needed increase in funding. The level of local funding continues to fall behind funding in other areas and does not reflect the fact the Cambridgeshire is one of the fastest growing counties. The NHS funding formula has determined that our population is growing at 0.1% below England average (!?) whereas in reality growth across the county has been 0.6%

above the England average for the past four years. Even putting that growth aside, our per head funding has always been too low. In Cambridgeshire, we receive £1,125 per capita, as compared with £1,244 in Bedfordshire, £1,288 in West Suffolk and £1,497 in Norfolk. During the debate, the Minister agreed to meet me and our Clinical Commissioning Group's Chief Executive to discuss these concerns in more detail. I will of course let you know how that meeting goes.

The Government has re-opened the Rural Community Energy Fund – a £10 million programme to support rural communities in England to develop community-based renewable energy projects. Further details are available here: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/rural-community-energy-fund.

The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority is consulting on the Local Transport Plan. Open until 27 September, the consultation will help to shape how we deal with the challenges of a growing area sustainably. See: https://tinyurl.com/y5cxw6f.

Until 5 August, you can also feedback on the Greater Cambridge Partnership's proposals for the Melbourn and Sawston Greenways. These Greenways routes will enable cyclists, walkers and equestrians to travel sustainably from Melbourn and Sawston into Cambridge. ### A STATEMENT FROM MIKE NETTLETON FORMER CHAIR OF GREAT SHELFORD PARISH COUNCIL

I've been a Councillor for five years, Chair of Highways for one year and Chair of GSPC for three years. Done properly, it is a hard, time-consuming job. The only reason I did it was to help deliver services and projects for the village which residents actually wanted. In June I resigned – why?

By and large GSPC has a group of talented, hardworking Councillors, for which we should all be grateful. However, some other Councillors have no interest in delivering 'stuff' for the village, instead choosing to pursue their own agendas and continually criticising Councillors who are trying to get things done. These people make close to zero contribution to the village.

The issues were brought to a head by problems with cricket balls from matches being played on the Rec being hit into gardens in Woodlands Road (you may well be thinking this is trivial, but remember we are talking about a Parish Council). By 2018 some residents were considering taking out an injunction to try to prevent cricket being played on the Rec. GSPC delegated Malcolm Watson, the Clerk and me to negotiate a solution with residents and the cricket club. By spring this year we had reached a solution which was acceptable to everyone (briefly residents would pay for retractable netting, which the cricket club would deploy on match days and GSPC would allow the netting to be installed on the perimeter of the Rec). Progress in these negotiations was regularly reported back to GSPC. At the 15 May GSPC meeting we agreed that we needed a brief operating agreement between all parties (but not a legal document) and I was to draw that up.

At the beginning of June contractors began installation of the nets. On 5 June I received highly critical emails from two Councillors (words such as 'crazy' and 'negligent' were used) and I therefore convened an emergency meeting of GSPC that evening. At that meeting GSPC decided:

- All work on the netting was to stop immediately.
- The residents were not to be allowed to deploy the netting.
- Legal advice was to be obtained before any further work could be done. I was also told I had acted without the authority of GSPC in negotiating with the residents and Cricket Club and in drawing up an operating agreement. I told the meeting that I was not about to tell residents and Cricket Club that I had conducted six months' negotiations with them in bad faith and therefore resigned.

Subsequently at the 19 June GSPC meeting four Councillors made an unsuccessful attempt to alter the minutes of the 15 May meeting regarding the operating agreement and legal advice.

### NO TOILETS ON THE REC

For several years residents have been asking the Parish Council (GSPC) to install toilets on the Rec and they made provision of £30,000 in the 2018–19 budget to do the work.

GSPC asked for feedback from Feast goers in July 2018 to assess whether residents wanted them to go ahead with the work and 90% of written responses received were in favour, together with loads of verbal support, including from early morning dog walkers, parents of young children and elderly people.

GSPC therefore asked Graham Townsend and Judith Wilson to start a project to work out how to deliver the toilets. They have put a lot of hard work into identifying a solution which ticks all the boxes (affordable, vandal resistant, frost proof, cleaning issues, etc.) and presented their recommendations to the GSPC meeting on 19 June. That meeting voted not to proceed because of 'escalating costs' and no demonstrable need for the toilets.

I believe they are wrong. If you agree, please write to the Clerk and let GSPC know your feelings.

original signing of the Charter, and then on to the Feast Marquee for the *vin d'honneur*, accompanied by speeches and gifts. After this, visitors and host families enjoyed a traditional afternoon tea in the Memorial Hall, with a children's Teddy Bear's Picnic sponsored by Waitrose, and culminating with the cutting of the commemorative cake, provided and decorated by Cornelia Ede



Restored by sandwiches, scones, cake and tea, the group then embarked on an energetic ceilidh – a private event for the first hour where even those who had never danced before were persuaded onto the dance floor, but then from 7.30 the doors were thrown open to all comers for a community ceilidh as a first joint venture with the Feast.

On Monday, the group spent the day at Burghley House, with a special quiz for both children and adults and a picnic in the grounds afterwards. And on Tuesday morning a crocodile of smiling French children set off to join classes in Shelford School,





### Old Rews

### Extracts from The Great Shelford Chronicle 1774–1868

Compiled and re-published by Anne George, Glynis Trundle, Margaret Ward and Alan Bullwinkle, 1993

### 5 August 1814

STUMP CROSS TURNPIKE ROAD – The Trustees of the Turnpike Rds ... will meet ... for the purpose of ... erecting a Toll Gate at Great Shelford, across a certain highway leading from Little Shelford to Cam. Opposite the George Inn in Great Shelford aforesaid; as well as a Side Gate across a lane there leading to Mr Nutter's Mill.

### 14 August 1818

DIED – On Tuesday last, aged 73 years, Mr Peter Grain, of Great Shelford, who, in the relative duties of husband, father and friend, sustained a character equally respectable in itself and highly useful to society at large.

### 1 August 1823

INQUEST – On Saturday afternoon last, John Jennings, son of Mr Jennings, a respectable farmer of Shelford, near this place, was found drowned in the river. It is supposed he over-reached himself in attempting to cut some rushes. Every exertion was made to restore animation but without effect. The above youth, though only eight years old, is said to have weighed nine stone. A short time since his parents were offered a considerable sum of money for the purpose of exhibiting him as a prodigy of nature, but which they refused. On Sunday an inquest was held on view of the body, before John Ingle, Esq., when the jury returned a verdict of 'accidental death'.

### 16 August 1833

On Tuesday last John Stallon, the convict under sentence of death in the County Gaol, retracted his former strong protestations of innocence, and confessed that he had wilfully occasioned fires (12 in number) at Great Shelford ... The culprit states that he had no malice or ill will against any of the persons whose property he set on fire, and that his only object was to occasion the necessity of working the engine, for which, as one of the assistants, he received 6 shillings and 6 pence each time.

### SHELFORD FEAST 2019

The week had included something for everyone, and sales of weekly tickets reached a new high as audiences realised what good value they were for attending several events. 25 years after our traditional Feast was revived there

was a young person's disco, church meetings, a Twinning ceilidh, a hugely successful Quiz, the Ritzy Tea, Sawston Youth Drama, comedy night, music and bands galore ... and a veritable feast of food and drink with more variety than ever.

So on a weekend when England, against all odds, became cricket world champions, Lewis Hamilton won the British Grand Prix, there were nail-biting wins at Wimbledon and in the





Tour de France, when wartime aircraft swooped low over our Recreation Ground, Great Shelford came together with smiles on their faces and almost ideal weather. We had more music on the grand inflatable stage, with Sawston Samba, Reavey Bros, Cambridge Brass Band and Shelford School Choir, plus the Big Beats drummers.

And while there are sixteen members of The Bunch who organise this throughout the year, there must be more than a hundred volunteers who made the events work, particularly on Saturday and Sunday.



So, to those who slaved away behind the bar, in the food tent, behind the stalls, cleaning the toilets and filling the skips, plumbing the water or presenting their classic cars, sponsoring events and participating in them, setting up and taking down, we say a massive THANK YOU!

And don't forget to come to The Shelford Feast on Sunday 12 July 2020!





Hang out the banners! Sound the trumpets! Hug your neighbours! Great Shelford Cricket Club adults have won a game! Make that two games!

Yes, Saturday 6 July was a momentous day for the club because we finally tasted victory for the first time this season. To give that some context, our First XI won for the first time in 30 matches, our last win having been in September 2017. Under Alan Sutton's astute captaincy, the Firsts beat Royston in a nail-biting game at the Rec by 27 runs. Nerves were shredded as the heavens




